Speeding and Driver Error

Speed-related crashes accounted for 34% of fatalities among 16-19 years olds. Speeding is a factor in 1 out of every 3 teen fatal crashes.

Agreement: Student will not drive over 25 miles-per-hour on the GC Tech campus._

Consequences: First time the student will lose their parking permit for two weeks. Second time the student will have his/her permit taken away._

Designated Parking Area

For reasons related to school safety, student must park in the Student Parking Designated Areas and have their Parking Permit conspicuously displayed at all times, by hanging them on the front mirror.

Cellphones & Texting

NY State law prohibits all drivers from using portable electronic devices. Illegal activity includes holding a portable electronic device and : talking on a hand held mobile phone, composing, sending, reading, accessing, browsing, transmitting, saving , or retrieving electronic data such as e-mail, text messages or webpages; viewing, taking, or transmitting images; and or playing games. Of fatal crashes among 15-19 year old drivers involving distractions, 21% were identified as using cellphones.

Agreement: Student will not use cell-phone when driving

Consequence: Office reminder. If it continues, a call will be made to the parent and possible loss of parking permit.

Music, Food and Other Distractions

Driver distractions, such as eating and changing music, were indicated for 16% of all drivers involved in fatal crashes for people under the ages of 20.

Agreement: Student will keep music low, avoid changing music and refrain from eating while driving.

Consequence: Office reminder. If it continues, a call will be made to the parent and possible loss of parking privilege.

According to a recent study, the presence of just one more teen in a car nearly doubles the chance of a fatal crash.

Seatbelts

Of teens ages 13-19 who died in car crashes in 2012, 52% of drivers and 59% of passengers were not wearing a seat belt.

Agreement: It is the law to have your seat belt on at all time

Consequences: Office reprimand and parent contact. If it happens a 2nd time loss of parking permit for 1 week. If it continues, student will lose parking privilege.
