

Less Is Sometimes More Quick Reference Guides for Instructional Data Warehouse Users

The Instructional Data Warehouse (IDW) was created by Nassau BOCES in 2001. At that time, reports were only available for the ELA and Math Grade 4 and Grade 8 assessments. The reports were in the form of data cubes which had layers of data but were cumbersome and difficult to use for some. In ensuing years, Nassau BOCES produced more user friendly reports for all Grade 3-8 assessments, Regents exams, Advanced Placement Exams, NYSESLAT exams, College Tracking, and much more.

Like any reengineered system, the IDW became, for some, challenging to navigate with its numerous offerings and variety of reports. Compare JFK airport to a regional airport like Islip. Expansiveness and diversity of offerings are often desirable, but simplicity and immediacy do have their advantages. Nassau BOCES is now offering both complexity and simplicity for two different segments of IDW users. For those IDW users who want more, the full gamut of reports and dashboards are available as before. Experienced users can still click on the Dashboards or Reports folders and be led to the entire lists of reports available after clicking on the "Team Content" Icon on the opening page. (See Dashboards and Reports below, circled in red.)



But some users just want to view a limited list of instructional reports. Grade

3 through 8 administrators can view reports dedicated to their special needs, and high school administrators and chair people can view a separate list dedicated to their specific needs. As shown on the following pages, these reports are described with visuals to make users familiar with the reports.

And, of course, those specialized reports for **Guidance Counselors** and for **teachers** remain organized in separate folders as they have been in recent years. High School counselors will see reports for their schools only, and each teacher will see reports for both their current and previous classroom rosters.
