So Many Reports in the IDW—Where Do I Begin?
Suggestions on How To Navigate the Instructional Data Warehouse


When the typical user logs on to the Instructional Data Warehouse and clicks on the "Team Content" logo, four folders appear (five or six for a limited number of districts). Two of the folders "School Counselor Reports" and "Teacher Interface," are limited dedicated to counselor and teacher specific needs. Each of these two folders are self explanatory when opened.

The two other two folders, however, "Dashboards" and "Reports," open up a variety of options which may be confusing to some. This newsletter is designed to highlight the most commonly used reports and to make the navigation journey a little simpler for even experienced IDW users.

There are 18 dashboards, and each opens immediately to a default visual display without the need for an intermediary "prompt page" as exists in the "Reports" section (see sample below). Dashboards, instead, have either tabs or "check-boxes" to change the parameters of the visualizations. Some of the dashboards do not apply to all districts. For example, a dashboard for each third party exams (iReady, NWEA and STAR) is listed, but typically each district employs only one. IDW users should peruse the list of dashboards and click on any of the descriptive titles for a visualization that might be useful. **Dashboards are generally used less frequently than Reports.** 

The "Reports" folder, when clicked, reveals seven additional folders and more than 50 separate reports. Some of the seven "Reports" folders also contain multiple reports. "College Tracking," for example, has nine reports. Few IDW users have the time to sample each report, so this newsletter will highlight the most frequently used reports, the ones featured in our training sessions which are open to all IDW users.

A key feature of each report is the prompt page like the one below for the Gap Report.



The prompt page allows the user to choose the precise parameters for the report requested. The report may be a table, a chart, or both. The prompt page also includes a description of the report's purpose, directions for choosing options, and tips to fill in the prompts for best results.

It makes sense to view these reports from two different perspectives, just as our IDW training sessions do. The **first perspective will be for Grade 3-8 administrators** and the **second for high school administrators and chair people.** Remember that there are already separate folders for counselors and for teachers who are able to view a limited number of reports. Each report can be found in the alphabetical listing of folders and reports. The alphabetical list of folders precedes the alphabetical list precedes of reports.

The reports listed below emphasize that data must have context to have meaning for educators. That is why each report notes a comparison to previous year's data or to a common benchmark achieved by others. Some reports have both. The visualizations below are shown just to familiarize the user with the look of the report not as a sample to be read in detail.



Many of the reports listed on the previous pages also have multiple variants on the Reports menu. Viewing these key reports, however, will give the user a survey of some of the most essential reports in the IDW. For example, when you view the district Snapshot Report, you will see that that there is also a report for individual buildings and that you can choose to go back in history to view previous years' Snapshot Reports.

Similarly, when you view the iReady, NWEA, or STAR Comparison Reports, you will see that there are many other third party reports that are of interest to school administrators. Each report is designed to give different insights on school and district performance.

And, finally, while perusing these reports, you may discover or remember other favorite reports and dash-boards like the Demographic Trends Dashboard which gives a historical view of demographic patterns for a district or school. See sample below.
